# E NGLISH

**SIZE:** -a) 37 3/4" -b) 40 1/8" -c) 42 1/2" -d) 44 7/8" finished bust measurement

**UK Sizes: -a)** 8-10 **-b)** 12-14 **-c)** 16-18 **-d)** 20-22

The model in the photograph is wearing size -a) 8-10

## **MATERIALS**

BOMBAY: -a) 4 -b) 4 -c) 5 -d) 5 balls col. 2027

| Knitting<br>needles      | Stitches   |
|--------------------------|--|
| Size 6 (U.S.)/<br>(4 mm) | Stockinette st<br>(see basic instructions)         |
|                          | Reverse stockinette st<br>(see basic instructions) |
|                          | Garter st (see basic instructions)                 |
|                          | Stripe st<br>(see explanation)                     |
|                          | Stripe st & short row<br>shaping (see explanation) |

#### Stripe st:

\* 4 rows stockinette st,

6 rows reverse stockinette st \*

Rep from \* to \*.

## Stripe st & short row shaping:

\* From 1st to 4th row: stockinette st

**5<sup>th</sup> row:** K70, turn work leaving **-a)** 40 **-b)** 42 **-c)** 44 **-d)** 46 sts **on hold.** 

6th row: P70

7<sup>th</sup> row: K35, turn work leaving -a) 75 -b) 77

-c) 78 -d) 80 sts on hold.

8th row: P35

From  $9^{\text{th}}$  to  $14^{\text{th}}$  row: work all sts in reverse

stockinette st \*.

Rep from \* to \* a total of -a) 14 -b) 15 -c) 16 -d) 17 times and finish with 4 rows in stocki-

nette st.

**Note:** to ensure that the short row shaping doesn't produce a step effect when bringing back into work the sts left on hold from one row to another, **pick up** the bar of yarn between the last knitted st and the next st to be worked, slip it onto the LH needle and work it tog with the next st to be knitted.

#### GAUGE

Using size 6 needles in *stripe st*: 20 sts & 30 rows = 4x4"

#### BACK

Note: This is knitted horizontally.

Cast on -a) 110 -b) 112 -c) 114 -d) 116 sts. Work in *stripe* st & short row shaping.

When back measures -a) 26 1/4" (66,5 cm) -b) 28" (71 cm) -c) 29 3/4" (75,5 cm) -d) 31 1/2" (80 cm), measuring from the start of the right side edge of the garment, and coinciding with the end of the *stripe st* & *short row shaping*, bind (cast off) all sts.

### **FRONT**

Work same as back except for neckline.

Neckline: When front measures -a) 3 7/8" (10 cm) -b) 4 3/8" (11 cm) -c) 4 3/4" (12 cm) -d) 5 1/8" (13 cm), measuring from the start of the left side edge, bind (cast off) at left side edge at beg of every 4<sup>th</sup> row (=wrong side of work); 1 st 10 times.

Work **-a)** 4 **-b)** 6 **-c)** 12 **-d)** 14 more rows then **increase** at left side edge at beg of every 4<sup>th</sup> row (= wrong side of work): 1 st 10 times.

When front measures -a) 18 7/8" (48 cm)
-b) 20 1/8" (51 cm) -c) 21 1/4" (54 cm)
-d) 22 1/2" (57 cm), measuring from the start of the left side edge of the garment, and coinciding with the end of the stripe st & short row shaping, bind (cast off) all sts.

## **SLEEVES**

**Cast on -a)** 58 **-b)** 62 **-c)** 66 **-d)** 70 sts. Work in *stripe st*.

When sleeve measures 1 5/8" (4 cm), measuring from the start, **increase** at each edge (= 1 st in from the edge) of every 6<sup>th</sup> row: 1 st 8 times.

Total: -a) 74 -b) 78 -c) 82 -d) 86 sts.

When sleeve measures -a) 8 5/8" (22 cm) -b) 9" (23 cm) -c) 9 1/2" (24 cm) -d) 9 7/8" (25 cm), measuring from the start, bind (cast off) all sts. Make another sleeve the same.

## FINISHING (MAKING UP)

Baste the pieces tog with right sides facing and block (press) the part with the short row shaping more than the part without the short row shaping. All the seams are sewn using *side seams* (see basic instructions).

Sew one shoulder.

Collar: Pick up all the sts around the neckline increasing or decreasing where necessary on the 1st row in order to obtain a total of: -a) 110 -b) 114 -c) 118 -d) 122 sts. Work 3 rows in garter st then bind (cast off) all the sts in the following manner: \* K2 tog, slip the st resulting from knitting 2 sts tog back onto the LH needle \* rep from \* to \* until no sts remain.

Sew the other shoulder and the neck join.

Sleeves: Attach sleeves = match centre of sleeve head to shoulder seam and make edges of sleeve head (= armhole depth) measure a distance of -a) 7 1/8" (18 cm) -b) 7 1/2" (19 cm) -c) 7 7/8" (20 cm) -d) 8 1/4" (21 cm) from the shoulder seam. Sew.

With the garment laid out completely flat, carefully **block (press)** the recently sewn seams.

Sew sides and underarm seams.
